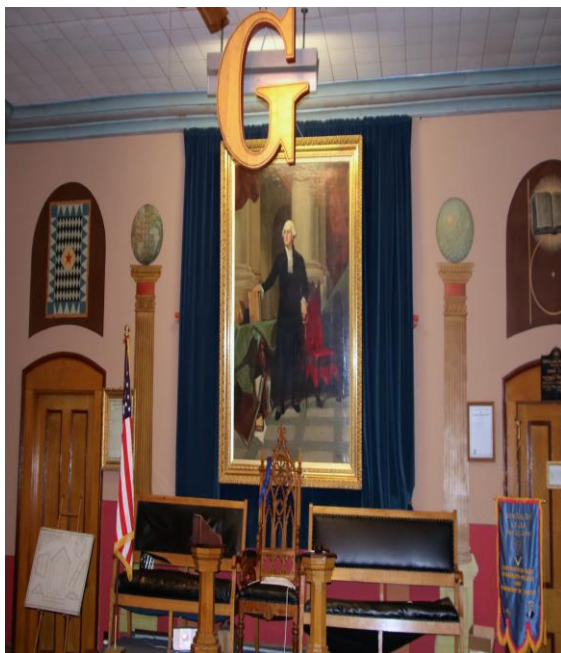

MESSAGE FROM THE EAST **Greetings, Brethren of Central Lodge #6**

I attended the George Washington Masonic National Memorial for the 100-year Cornerstone Ceremony in Alexandria, Virginia. My travel partner was WM Pete Czarnowski from Kiowa Lodge #116. The Grand Masters' meeting took place at the Scottish Rite House of the Temple. I met PGM/DSGIG Karl Hinkle in line to board our plane. The parade to

the Monument took place Monday, February 20 and was attended by over 4000 Masons. Grand Masters from all 50 states were present for the ceremony. Pete and I were privileged to march along with MWGM Ross Allen, RWDGM Dave Reynolds, and RWSGW Bill Marshall, as well as dignitaries from DeMolay, including GM Jon Sellars. The day was beautiful and sunny with unseasonably warm temperatures.

We went on a tour of the Scottish Rite House of the Temple, where we were honored to meet the Grand Commander of the Southern Jurisdiction of AASR, Brother Jim Cole. He had asked the tour guide staff to bring tours through his office while he was in town since there were so many Masons in town for the event.

To top off our "Tour of Washington Sites", we visited Mt Vernon, home of Brother G. Washington. It so happened we visited on his birthday, which made for a few added perks. A large group of immigrants were lining up at a desk marked as "Immigration and Naturalization" and they were all dressed "to the nines." There was a Citizenship Ceremony scheduled for that day. Having served in the Immigration Service, I found it a bit emotional to see so many immigrants not only doing it right, but proud to become Americans. The tour

of Mt Vernon was cool, but George himself (a first-person actor) made an appearance for birthday cake served to all.

Finally, on my way to the airport, I made a stop at Arlington National Cemetery for a visit to the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier.

I was pleased to represent Central #6 and wished more Brothers could have joined me on the trip. It was truly the trip of a lifetime and will be remembered for a long time. I recommend a visit to Brother George's Masonic National Memorial for any Mason visiting the Washington, DC area. You will not be disappointed.
